

SUSTAINABILITY

The Brokenwood Sustainability journey began over 10 years ago with a focus on continuous improvement & more recently a commitment to formalise our sustainability credentials by becoming a certified member of Sustainable Winegrowing Australia for our Hunter based Winery & Hunter Valley owned & managed Vineyards. This of course includes our flagship Graveyard Vineyard Shiraz & is a testament to the Winemaking & Viticulture teams as custodians of this remarkable site.

We demonstrate this by our commitment and compliance to the requirements of the:

- Freshcare Australian Wine Industry Standard of Sustainable Practice Viticulture Standard, Winery Standard and the Freshcare Rules
- Sustainable Winegrowing Australia
- Legislative requirements; to ensure we safeguard the natural environment in which our business operates.



Energy Efficiency; Focus improving our energy efficiency onsite by upgrading our refrigeration plant and supplementing our onsite energy usage with a 99kW Solar PV array, this has reduced our energy usage by 23%.



Waste Management; We have been a signatory to the Australian Packaging Covenant Organisation (APCO) since 2010, and have made a commitment to achieving the 2025 National Packaging Targets. All our waste grape marc is composted and reused as mulch undervine.



Biodiversity; We have planted native insectary corridors & mid row cover crops to enhance biodiversity & promote resilience in the Vineyard and reduce our chemical usage.



Workplace diversity, equity & inclusion; Women in the organisation make up 70% of our workplace, many of these in management positions.

GRAVEYARD VINEYARD Hunter Valley Shiraz

Old vines, own roots and low yields.

Graveyard Vineyard Shiraz is Brokenwood's signature wine. The 53 year old vines from this vineyard produce a consistent high quality wine. A classic, medium bodied Shiraz with red fruit aromas and great finesse. A seamless palate of savoury Shiraz, with subtle French oak flavours and fine tannins. A wine suitable for extended bottle maturation.

Awarded the prestigious rating of 'Exceptional'in the Langton's Classification of Australian Wine V', the Graveyard Vineyard Shiraz remains the highest placed shiraz from the Hunter Valley.



Soil Definitions:

LOAM:

A fertile soil of clay and sand containing humus.

HUMUS

A dark, organic material that forms in soil when plant and animal matter decays.

FRIABLE

Easily crumbled.

CALCAREOUS

Containing calcium carbonate; chalky.

ALLUVIAL SOIL

A fine-grained fertile soil deposited by water flowing over flood plains or in river beds.

SCHIST

A coarse-grained metamorphic rock which consists of layers of different minerals and can be split into thin irregular plates.

HISTORY

1970 - 1972

The Establishment

Established in 1970, Brokenwood was founded by a trio of Sydney-based solicitors, Tony Albert, John Beeston and James Halliday. The original block was destined to be a cricket ground for the local community but was instead planted with Shiraz and Cabernet Sauvignon.

1973 - 1975

The First Vintage

The first vintage was picked in 1973 and while none of the original partners claimed to know anything about viticulture, the wine received praise, and attracted a loyal following from the start. In 1975, a new winery was built to accommodate the growing production. Visitors tasted the very limited and eagerly sought after boutique wines made by the weekend winemakers from a table standing in the shade of the first floor balcony.

1978 - 1981

The Formative Years

Growth was steady until the boom of 1978, when six new partners joined, allowing the purchase of the next door Graveyard Vineyard. In the same year, Brokenwood sourced fruit from outside the Hunter Valley for the first time; Cabernet Sauvignon from Coonawarra. This was blended with Hunter Valley fruit to make a premium red, creating the style that has been synonymous with Brokenwood for the last 40 years.

1982 - 1991

The First White Wines

In 1982 the company extended its range to include white wines, notably Semillon; the jewel in Australia's wine crown. Iain Riggs joined Brokenwood in 1982, introducing new winery equipment and facilities specifically for premium white wine production. Brokenwood's single vineyard philosophy has grown to capture the essence of our premium sites throughout Australia. In 1983 the first single vineyard selection for the Graveyard Vineyard was made.

1993 - 2004

Building Brokenwood

The barrel shed was completed in 2004, allowing high quality temperature controlled maturation for whites and reds. The last chardonnay vines received their marching orders from the Graveyard, with the vineyard being now entirely shiraz. During this period, Brokenwood also completed its move from cork finishes to the more reliable screwcap.

2009 - 2011

The Winemakers

In 2009, Stuart Hordern joins the Brokenwood winery team.
P-J Charteris moves on from Brokenwood after 12 years, in 2011. Iain Riggs celebrates his 30th vintage in 2012 with Brokenwood.

2014 - 2015

New Era

Stuart Hordern is announced as Senior Winemaker in December 2014. Kate Sturgess joins the Brokenwood winemaking team in July of 2015. Brokenwood Wines win big at the 2015 Hunter Valley Wine Show going home with 5 trophies and 20 out of 22 wines entered receiving a medal.

2018 - 2023

Monumental Steps

In December of 2018 Brokenwood Wines celebrates the grand opening of the new cellar door and The Wood restaurant building. In 2019 after only being open for a few months it won the award for best Cellar Door in the Hunter Valley. In 2020, Iain Riggs retires as Managing Director and Chief Winemaker. Brokenwood's two flagships wines won major awards on the 2021 Halliday Wine Companion, with the 2018 Graveyard Vineyard Shiraz wining 'Wine of the Year', and 2014 ILR Reserve Semillon taking out the top spot in the 'Best Semillon' category!
